- When handling and/or transporting your boat, always pick up the boat from the front, keeping all moving parts pointed away from you.
- Always keep a safe distance in all directions around your model to avoid collisions or injury. This model is controlled by a radio signal subject to interference from many sources outside your control. Interference can cause momentary loss of control.
- Always operate your model in open spaces away from full-size vehicles, traffic and people.
- Always carefully follow the directions and warnings for this and any optional support equipment (chargers, rechargeable battery packs, etc.).
- Always keep all chemicals, small parts and anything electrical out of the reach of children.

# Water-Resistant Boat with Waterproof Electronics

Your new Horizon Hobby boat has been designed and built with a combination of waterproof and water-resistant components to allow you to operate the product in calm, fresh water conditions.

While the entire boat is highly water-resistant, it is not completely waterproof and your boat should NOT be treated like a submarine. The various electronic components used in the boat, such as the ESC, servo(s) and receiver are waterproof, however, most of the mechanical components are water-resistant and require additional maintenance after use.

# **General Precautions**

- Read the WET CONDITIONS MAINTENANCE procedures and make sure that you have all the tools you will need to properly maintain your boat.
- Not all batteries can be used in wet conditions. Consult the battery manufacturer before use. Caution should be taken when using Li-Po batteries in wet conditions.
- Most transmitters are not water-resistant. Consult your transmitter's manual or the manufacturer before operation.
- Never operate your transmitter or boat when lightning is present.
- Salt water is very conductive and highly corrosive. If you choose to run your boat in salt water, immediately rinse the boat in fresh water after each use. Operating your boat in salt water is at the sole discretion of the modeler.

# Wet Conditions Maintenance

 Drain any water that has collected in the hull by removing the drain plug or canopy and tilting the boat in the appropriate direction to drain the water.



**CAUTION:** Always keep hands, fingers, tools and any loose or hanging objects away from rotating parts.

- Remove the battery pack(s) and dry the contacts. If you have an air compressor or a can of compressed air, blow out any water that may be inside the recessed connector housings.
- Remove all moving parts. Dry and lubricate parts after every 30 minutes of operation or if the boat becomes submerged.

NOTICE: Never use a pressure washer to clean your boat.

- Use an air compressor or a can of compressed air to dry the boat and help remove any water that may have gotten into small crevices or corners.
- Spray the bearings, fasteners and other metal parts with a water-displacing light oil or lubricant.
- Let the boat air dry before you store it. Water (and oil) may continue to drip for a few hours.

The Blackjack 42 provides ample space for large batteries. Use two 4S 5000–9000mAh batteries with 100C or greater for optimal performance.

We recommend using 2–4 4S 5000mAh Smart batteries (SPMX54S100H5). A Parallel Y-Harness with IC5 (SPMXCA509) is required (sold separately) for 4 batteries.

Choose a charger designed to charge the recommended Spektrum  $^{\rm TM}$  14.8V 5000mAh 100C SMART LiPo batteries with IC5  $^{\textcircled{R}}$  Connectors (SPMX54S100H5).

# **Battery Pack Installation**

- 1. Loosen the four thumbscrews on the battery hatch and remove it from the hull.
- Loosen the hook and loop straps, and install the fully charged batteries fully forward in the battery compartment. Secure the batteries with the hook and loop straps.
- 3. Connect the batteries to the ESC.

**WARNING:** When using two batteries, always make sure the batteries are of similar type (voltage and capacity). Connecting batteries of mismatched capacity may result in battery over discharge, which could result in fire causing property damage or personal injury.

We recommend the Spektrum SMART S2200 G2 AC 2x200W Smart Charger (**SPMXC1010**).

Refer to your charger manual for charging instructions and safety information.

**NOTICE:** Never charge a battery in the boat or damage may result.

### **Positioning the Battery Packs**

- *Toward the Bow:* In rough water or strong wind conditions, place the battery packs at the front of the battery trays to ensure the greatest stability.
- Centered: Smooth water and calm winds may allow you to move the battery packs rear-ward in the hull to allow the bow to ride higher and increase speed. Be aware that positioning the batteries farther aft increases the likelihood of the boat blowing over at speed or becoming unstable.
- *Toward the Stern:* Positioning the batteries all the way back in their trays may provide higher top speeds but can cause instability. Experiment with this position only in very calm conditions while closely monitoring the hull's attitude as you increase speed.



## Antenna Tube Installation

Install the receiver antenna in the tube as shown. Do not bend the end of antenna over the antenna tube and place the cap over it or damage may result. The antenna does not have to be outside of the tube to operate properly.

Keep the end of the antenna above the boat's waterline to get the best transmitter reception.

**NOTICE:** Do not cut or kink the receiver antenna or damage may result.

## **Transmitter Functions**

### A/B. Channel 3 Button

- C. Throttle/Brake
- **D. Steering Wheel**

### E. AVC/ST Rate

Adjusts the end point of the steering

### F. Brake Rate

Adjusts the braking end point.

### G. ST Trim

Adjusts the steering center point. Normally, the steering trim is adjusted until the vehicle tracks straight.

### H. TH Trim

Adjusts the throttle neutral point

I. SMART Battery Level Indicator

### J. Servo Reversing

To reverse the Throttle (TH) or Steering (ST) channel, switch the position of the correlating switch—"N" is for normal, "R" is for reverse.

### K. Throttle Limit

Limits throttle output to 50/75/100% Select 50% or 75% for less experienced drivers or when you are driving the vehicle in a small area.

### L. Power LED

- Solid red lights: Indicates radio connectivity and adequate battery power
- Flashing red lights: Indicates the battery voltage is critically low. Replace batteries
- M. Power Button
- N. Bind Button

## **Transmitter Battery Installation**

This transmitter requires 4 AA batteries.

- 1. Remove the battery cover from the transmitter.
- 2. Install the batteries as shown.
- 3. Install the battery cover.

**CAUTION:** Never remove the transmitter batteries while the model is powered ON. Loss of model control, damage, or injury may occur.

**CAUTION:** If using rechargeable batteries, charge only rechargeable batteries. Charging non-rechargeable batteries may cause the batteries to burst, resulting in injury to persons and/or damage to property.

**CAUTION:** Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to national regulations.







# Low Voltage Cutoff (LVC)

The factory default setting for the LVC in the ESC included with your boat is set at 3.2V per cell. Discharging a Li-Po battery below 3V per cell may damage your battery. The included ESC protects the boat battery from over-discharge using Low Voltage Cutoff (LVC). Before the battery charge decreases too much, LVC removes power supplied to the motor.

The boat drastically slows or stops completely once LVC is activated. Releasing the throttle and reapplying it will provide a limited amount of power to safely return the boat to shore. Repeated use after LVC is activated will damage the batteries.

Once LVC has been activated, the ESC status light will flash red continuously, indicating that the ESC is in LVC mode.

**NOTICE:** The LVC reserves battery capacity to allow you to safely return your boat to shore. Continued use after LVC has activated will damage your battery.

LVC can activate prematurely if you use (1) low C-rated batteries or (2) old, worn, and/or weak batteries.

Getting Started

- 1. Remove the canopy from the hull.
- 2. Install the receiver antenna in the antenna tube.
- 3. Install fully charged batteries fully forward in the compartment and secure them with the hook and loop straps.
- 4. Power on the transmitter. Ensure the throttle is not reversed and the throttle trim is neutral.
- 5. Connect the batteries to the ESC.
- 6. Press the ESC power button until the ESC beeps and lights up.



TIP: If you've installed freshly charged batteries, and LVC activates within the first minute of operation, replace your worn or weak batteries with the recommended batteries.

TIP: Monitor your boat battery's voltage before and after boating by using an XBC100 Smart Battery Checker and Servo Driver (SPMXBC100), sold separately.

Disconnect and remove the Li-Po battery from the boat after use to prevent trickle discharge. Charge your Li-Po battery to half capacity before storage. During storage, make sure the battery charge does not fall below 3V per cell. LVC does not prevent the battery from over-discharge during storage.



WARNING: Never use a LiPo battery in NiMH mode. Using a LiPo in NiMH mode may result in a fire causing property damage and personal injury.

- 7. Install the canopy on the hull.
- IMPORTANT: To rebind the Blackjack 42, refer to your receiver manual.



# **Control Check**

**IMPORTANT:** Perform a control check at the beginning of each boating session, after repair, or after installation of new batteries.

Ensure the receiver antenna is extended properly and all batteries are fully charged.

- 1. Power ON the transmitter and the boat. Do not install the battery compartment.
- 2. Place the boat on a steady surface.
- 3. Check the AVC/ST Position, ST Trim, and TH Trim on the transmitter.



# **Testing Your Boat in the Water**

- 1. Carefully place the boat in the water.
- 2. If the boat does not go straight, adjust the ST Trim dial on the transmitter.
- 3. Return the boat to shore when it begins to slow or when LVC activates.
- 4. Power off the ESC and disconnect the battery.
- 5. Turn off the transmitter.

**NOTICE:** Always power OFF the receiver before powering OFF the transmitter. If the transmitter is powered OFF before the boat, the receiver will enter failsafe mode.



**WARNING:** Do not to increase steering throw beyond the factory setting or servo failure may occur.

# **Boating Tips**

We recommend running the boat in 0–7 MPH winds and calm water conditions.

Maximum speeds are only achieved when water conditions are smooth and wind is minimal. A sharp turn in wind (stronger than 8–10 MPH) or waves can capsize the boat when it is moving at high speeds. A capsized boat can float away on windy days. Always pilot your boat in favorable wind and water conditions so that the boat does not capsize.

Consult local laws and ordinances before choosing a location to pilot your boat.

### When boating in water, avoid boating near:

- watercraft
- people (swimming areas, fishing areas)
- stationary objects
- waves, wakes
- rapidly moving water
- wildlife
- floating debris
- overhanging trees
- vegetation

## When You Are Finished

- 1. Power off the receiver by pressing the power button for 2 seconds.
- 2. Power off the transmitter.
- 3. Disconnect and remove the battery from the boat.



Practice driving the boat at low throttle by switching the transmitter preset throttle limiter to the medium setting. Advance the throttle setting as you become proficient with driving.

When using 4S power, do not attempt to skim sideways while turning or the boat will capsize.

Turning at speeds above 10 mph will cause the boat abruptly stop and possibly capsize. Practice turning the boat in no less than a 15 foot radius.

If you need to retrieve your boat from the water, use fishing equipment or another boat.



**CAUTION:** Never operate the boat in extreme temperatures, windy conditions or turbulent water.



**CAUTION:** Never attempt to retrieve a downed boat by swimming to retrieve it.

# After Boating and Maintenance

- After each use, remove the drain plug and hold the boat upright to drain all water from inside the hull.
- Reinstall the drain plug.
- Fully dry the inside and outside of the boat, including the water cooling lines and jacket around the motor.
- Remove the boat hatch, open the grease catch and all hatch doors (including the receiver box), and leave them propped open before storing your boat. We recommend placing the boat upside down to allow the water to continue to drain.
- Repair any damage or wear to the boat.
- Make note of lessons learned from the trimming of your boat, including water and wind conditions.

**NOTICE:** When you are finished boating, never leave the boat in direct sunlight or in a hot, enclosed area such as a car. Doing so can damage the boat.



# Binding

Binding is the process of programming the receiver to recognize the GUID (Globally Unique Identifier) code of a single specific transmitter. The DX3™ transmitter and SR6110AT receiver are bound at the factory. If you need to rebind, follow the instructions below. You must rebind when:

- Different failsafe positions are desired e.g., when throttle or steering reversing has been changed.
- Binding the receiver to a different transmitter.
- Binding the transmitter to a different receiver.
- 1. Connect power to the receiver and quickly press and release the bind button three times (within 1.5 seconds).
- 2. Press and hold the bind button and to put the receiver in bind mode. release the buton when the LED starts to flash rapidly, indicating it is in bind mode.

The Blackjack 42 is equipped with the AR6110AT long range telemetry receiver. The AVC portion of this receiver is disabled (Default). AVC must be deactivated to achieve maximum performance and proper operation of the Blackjack 42.

When the AVC system has been disabled, the LED on the receiver will show three flashes upon power up, and then remain lit. The receiver is bound and operating normally when the LED remains illuminated.

**TIP:** If the AVC feature in the receiver is active and the AVC menu in the transmitter is Inhibited, AVC functions will default to the AUX 1 and AUX 2 operation, and in this scenario, AVC will not work correctly.

# Selecting INH in the AVC menu on your transmitter will not disable AVC.

If using a SMART ESC and SMART battery, the transmitter SMART Battery Level indicator will show the vehicle battery level within 10 seconds of powering on and binding.



# Failsafe

In the unlikely event that the radio connection is lost during use, the receiver will drive the servo and ESC to their preprogrammed failsafe positions (normally no throttle and straight steering). If the receiver is powered on before powering on the transmitter, the receiver will enter this failsafe mode. When the transmitter is powered on, normal control is resumed.

# **ESC** and Transmitter Calibration

- 1. Begin with the transmitter and receiver binding complete.
- 2. Set your transmitter's throttle channel to 100% travel and trim to neutral.
- 3. Turn on your transmitter and connect a battery to the ESC but don't power it on.
- Press and hold the Set button while turning on the ESC. When the red LED begins to flash, release the Set button. The ESC will enter programming mode if the button is pressed for more than three seconds.

**TIP:** The red LED should be flashing when the ESC enters calibration mode. If the green LED is flashing the ESC is in programming mode.

- 5. Leave the throttle trigger at the neutral position, then press and release the Set button. The red LED will stop flashing, the green LED will flash one time and the motor will make a tone to indicate the neutral position has been accepted.
- 6. Hold the throttle trigger at the full throttle position then press and release the Set button. The green LED will flash twice and the motor will make two tones to indicate the full throttle position has been accepted.
- 7. Hold the throttle trigger at the full brake position then press and release the Set button. The green LED will flash three times and the motor will make three tones to indicate the full brake position has been accepted.

The motor will operate normally after calibration is completed.

# Programming with the SMART Programmer Box

- 1. Unplug the fan and connect the programming lead to the fan port.
- 2. Connect a battery to the ESC.
- 3. Power on the box and select the parameter with the SELECT button.

### **160A Programmable Options**

- 4. Change the values of the selected parameter with the EDIT button
- Press the SAVE button to save the changes. The ESC requires a power cycle to implement the saved changes.

# Motor Care

- Prolong motor life by preventing overheating conditions. Undue motor wear results from frequent turns, stops and starts, pushing objects, boating in rough water or vegetation and boating continuously at high speed.
- Over-temperature protection is installed on the ESC to prevent circuit damage, but cannot protect the motor from pushing against heavy resistance.

# Water Cooling System

If water does not stream out of the water outlets while the boat is moving forward, immediately stop the boat and clean the obstruction from the water cooling system.

- 1. Disassemble and clean the water cooling system to remove blockage and prevent overheating.
- 2. Replace damaged parts.

 Lubrication is important to prevent motor damage. If your motor gets wet, lubricate the busings supporting the motor shaft with light duty machine oil. Failure to do so can cause the motor shaft to seize against the motor bushings.



**CAUTION:** Do not touch the motor until it has had time to cool. It can become extremely hot when in use.



- 1. Disconnect the water tube from the rudder.
- 2. Remove the nut, screw and linkage from the rudder arm.
- 3. Turn the rudder and loosen the set screw from the rudder pin.
- 4. Turn over the boat and lightly tap the rudder to remove the pin.
- 5. Assemble in reverse order.

## **Propeller Service**

- 1. Use an 8mm nut driver (**DYN2805**) to loosen the nut from the driveshaft.
- 2. Remove the nut and propeller from the driveshaft.
- 3. Assemble in reverse order. Correctly align the propeller with the drive dog on the driveshaft.



## **Weight Tuning**

Depending on battery size and weight, additional ballast may be required to keep the nose of the boat down in rough conditions.

- 1. Add adhesive weights (LOSA99201) in front of the ESC.
- Slowly add the weights and test the boat's performance. Add or subtract weight until you achieve your desired performance.



# **Prop Angle Adjustment**

Raising the prop strut increases speed, but also decreases steering response and increases cavitation.

Lowering the drive strut increases steering response, but also increases steering sensitivity and decreases speed.

- 1. Loosen 2 bolts and 2 nuts from the drive strut on the rear of the boat.
- 2. Slide the strut up or down to change the angle of the propeller in relation to the hull.
- 3. Adjust as desired and tighten the nuts and bolts.

**TIP:** Finding the proper prop angle will reduce the chance of a blow over and/or porpoising.





## **Drivetrain Lubrication**

Always replace the drivetrain parts when they are damaged or show visible wear or injury and damage may result.

Lubricating the flex shaft is vital to the life of the drivetrain. The lubricant also acts as a water seal, keeping water from entering the hull through the stuffing tube.

Lubricate the flex shaft and all moving parts after every 30 minutes of operation. Remove, clean, and lubricate the flex shaft after every boating session.

- 1. In the hull, use a 12mm and an 11mm open-end wrench to loosen the collet nut from the flex shaft.
- 2. Remove the two screws that secure the propeller strut from the mounting arm and the break away screw and rotate the rudder up.
- 3. Slide the flex shaft and propeller strut down and out from the stuffing tube toward the rear of the boat.

**TIP:** Use paper or cloth for cleaning and lubricating the flex shaft and other drivetrain parts.

- 4. Wipe the old lubricant and material from the flex shaft.
- 5. To remove the propeller strut, remove the propeller by removing the two prop nuts and slide the propeller off of the shaft. Using a 1.5mm driver loosen the drive dog setscrew, and slide the drive dog off the prop shaft. This will allow you to slide the prop strut off the flex shaft to lubricate the prop strut bearing.
- Lubricate the full length of the flex shaft assembly up to the drive dog using marine grease (**PRB0101 or PRB0100**). Also apply grease to the collet threads.
- 7. Carefully reinstall the flex shaft as well as the drive strut into the stuffing tube and collet. Ensure that the flex shaft is fully pushed into the collet. If the flex shaft is difficult to remove or install, use a flathead screwdriver to spread the grips of the collet.

Ensure there is a 1–2mm gap between the drive strut and drive dog to allow for flex shaft shrinkage under load.

**TIP:** It is a good idea to check the breakaway screw for any wear and replace if necessary.

**TIP:** If your flex shaft is not perfectly aligned with the collet, add shims to the stuffing tube support to center the flex shaft to the collet.

**NOTICE:** Running the boat in saltwater could cause some parts to corrode. If you run the boat in saltwater, rinse it thoroughly in freshwater after each use and lubricate the drive system.

**NOTICE:** Because of its corrosive effects, running RC boats in saltwater is at the discretion of the modeler.
